## NEBCA Novice Finals September 13-14, 2003

The NEBCA Novice Finals for 2003 were held on a late summer weekend in which the weather threatened, but ultimately was fairly benign. In fact, the overcast skies, intermittent rain, and associated cool temperatures probably favored the dogs more than the heat of sunny days would have. The trial was held at the beautiful 98-acre farm of Alix Cleveland and Tom Meagher in Nicholson, Pennsylvania. Alix and Tom extended their usual terrific hospitality to all of us, which, along with the challenging field, made this a trial to remember.

And, the field and sheep did give us pause. Three sheep – one Cheviot and two Katahdins – were used in each run. There was heavy pressure to the barn toward the right, but especially to the exhaust at the bottom left of the field, which particularly challenged the Novice/Novice and ProNovice dogs on the fetch. Even some of the Ranch dogs had to hustle to keep the sheep on the course. Dogs who stayed well off their sheep at the top were at a clear advantage.

Forty-six dogs and handlers hit the field on Saturday and Sunday: 11 in Novice/Novice, 23 in ProNovice, and 12 in Ranch. Bernie Armata did a great job of judging all three classes both days. The number of entries allowed each dog-handler team three runs, and the best two scores out of three were added up to give us the final standings.

Along with the familiar Long Road Awards for each class, the Alex McKinven Trophy was awarded as a NEBCA Novice Finals perpetual trophy to the highest placing novice handler running a self-trained dog in the Pro Novice

class.

We all want to thank Trial Manager, Sally Molloy, and the other members of the Novice committee, Liz Phillips and Michele Higgins, for their hard work on this trial. Michele painted the wonderful chairs that were awarded to Champion and Reserve Champion in each class. Dick Williams, Gene Sheninger, Joanne Murphy, Jim Murphy, and Warren Mick were invaluable for their help in setting up for the trial. Allan Lynch and Gene provided most of the set-out both days, and Joan Worthington helped with the record keeping. It was especially nice to pull in on Friday night and see folks such as Warren, Dick, and Allan – Open handlers who were not running dogs that weekend – there to support us and pitch in. And then there were those bleachers – custom made for us on the spot by Alix's brother, Bruce.

# **TAKE NOTE!!**

## **Three proposed changes to the NOVICE GUIDELINES:**

1. According to the current GENERAL NOVICE TRIAL GUIDELINES: "A dog may not be dropped more than one level from its highest level with any handler, regardless of the number of changes of ownership. The Novice Trial Committee will consider exceptions on a case-by-case basis."

### **Proposed change:**

A novice handler may drop ONE AND ONLY ONE dog down two levels from its highest level with any other handler. After a handler drops one dog down two levels, any subsequent dogs will only be permitted to drop down one level. Handlers who have dropped a dog down two levels may ONLY stay in their new class for twenty points, rather than the forty currently allocated to other teams.

2.) Our current novice guidelines for Ranch read as follows:

The Ranch Class consists of a full Open course with no shed. A dog is eligible to run in Ranch until the dog has earned 40 points and after earning 40 points won one Ranch Class with at least 6 dogs competing or until the dog places in the top ten of an Open trial with at least 12 dogs competing. a dog is no longer eligible to compete in ranch once he has placed in the top 10 in an open trial with at least 12 dogs competing.

### **Proposed change:**

The Ranch Class consists of a full Open course with no shed. A dog is eligible to run in Ranch until the dog has earned 40 points and after earning 40 points won one Ranch Class with at least 6 dogs competing or OR UNTIL THE DOG PLACES IN AN OPEN TRIAL AS DEFINED BY THE OPEN GUIDELINES.

3. A proposal to define the NEBCA Novice Trial Season:

"The last day of the novice trial season is the first Monday in September."

**Common Ground Sheepdog Trial**  
**September 6-7, 2003**  
**Norwich, Vermont**  
**Judge: Allan Lynch**

On Sept. 6 and 7, Sarah and Michael Nunan with a contingent of family, friends, and neighbors hosted the second annual Common Ground Sheep Dog Nursery Trial . The farm is tucked away in the verdant Vermont hills of Norwich, Vermont, conveniently located between I-89 and I-91. Cool crisp dewy mornings and warm sunny afternoons best describe this picture post card weekend. Spectators and handlers sat on a flat knoll overlooking the sloping trial field and the hills across the valley. This provided an excellent view of the action. There was plenty of room left along the side of the field for trailers and further viewing space.

The North Country Cheviots lived up to their reputation of being flighty. Dogs that were too pushy would find that the sheep would stand their ground and give the dog a hard time. Dogs who stayed off the sheep and gave them some space and time ended up with respectable runs. Allen Lynch, from Pennsylvania, expertly judged the trial and fun runs for the two days. There was time between runs for him to provide a quick critique and tips, which was appreciated by the novice handlers. Others who helped with the smooth running of the trial were the folks at the set out. The pen crew calmly moved sheep from the pen to the chute and out on to the field. Michael Dathe and Jody Somers took turns holding the spirited sheep at the post. Ribbons were awarded to fifth place in each class. Besides a ribbon, first place received a beautiful stoneware plate, second place maple syrup, and third place a gift certificate for a Ben and Jerry's Ice Cream Sundae.

During the two day trial in the morning there were homemade muffins, scones, apple pie and cookies to purchase along with drinks. Hot-dogs and hamburgers were cooked on the grill at lunch. Saturday night featured an all you can eat homemade lasagna dinner with fresh salad, local homegrown tomatoes, and fresh bread. The evening feast was topped off with a make your own sundae with Ben and Jerry's Ice Cream and a myriad of toppings. Sunday morning the handlers were treated to an oxen demonstration put on by Sarah Nunan. She raises and trains her own pair of oxen.

If you haven't attended this trial, you should put it on your list for next year. It is a well organized trial with friendly folks who make you feel welcomed. Thank you to Sarah and Michael and all those who helped put on a great weekend.

**PENNSYLVANIA STATE CHAMPIONSHIP SHEEPDOG TRIALS  
HOP BOTTOM, PENNSYLVANIA**

**JUNE 12-15, 2003**

**JUDGES- J.P. LaLonde- Novice, Tom Wilson- Open**

Torrential rains or what seemed to be monsoon season began the week of the Pennsylvania State Championship Stock Dog Trials for June of 2003 at Sheepy Hollow Farm in Hop Bottom, Pennsylvania. The rains continued on the first day of the trial during the novice classes. A total of 188 dogs ran in the young classes over the two days. The handlers had their hands full with the mixed bag of katahdin and wool crosses owned by Dick and Cheryl Jagger Williams. J.P LaLonde from Sydenham kept a watchful eye as he expertly judged each class of the young dogs. Gene Shenninger with some help from Dawn Boyce and Mary Brighoff carefully set out sheep to be sure all had even runs. Ross Klein of Joy Pet Foods made sure all winners received dog food as the top five in each class received a cash payback. Joy Pet Foods made it possible to pay back close to \$7000.00 in all the classes. Betty Murray in her very capable way made sure all scores were correct and posted as soon as possible. She is a key person in the trial running smoothly.

Alix Cleveland with her big tri rough coated Rob proved she could win in the rain or in the beautiful sunshine on Friday in the Novice/Novice class. Cokie Hamm with Zeb had tied with Alix but remained in second place after the runoff. Annie Palmer with her dog Kim took the reserve champion spot on Friday. Nick Karras provided a beautiful Border Fine Arts trophy for the overall champion of the Novice/Novice class which was presented to Alix with Rob. A special trophy provided by Joe and Karen Agazzi for the home trained dog who scored the highest points overall in the Novice/Novice class was won by Lois Myers and her female Rio.

The pro/novice class included a short cross drive which caused some of the dogs some confusion. Walt Jagger with his newly purchased Sam won the class on Friday and Mary Felegy won the class with her smooth coated female Becky who is also used for goose work. Cokie Hamm took the reserve with Breeze and Emma Court won the reserve status with her Marshall. The overall prize donated by Nick Karras was Walt Jagger with his speckled tri Floss.

The ranch class provided some exciting runs as the course was lengthened and had a very difficult cross drive. Dawn Boyce with her nursery dog Juno won it handily on Thursday with Heather Nadelman taking Reserve with Phyl. Eileen Stein captured the spotlight on Friday with her new dog Gyp and Nancy Ortez Sharp was reserve with Aldebaron. Heather Nadelman took the beautiful overall trophy donated by Nick Karas with her Phyl.

The USBCHA Nursery also provided the same challenges as Nancy Obernier took the win with her Ben on Thursday Renee Billadeau with her Rae was also qualified for the nationals. Brenda Buja with Bronco and Renee Billadeau again was qualified on Friday.

Saturday and Sundays open trial brought beautiful sunshine for the largest open classes ever run at Hop Bottom. The honorable Tom Wilson sorted out the runs aptly with the skill only expected by a national ranked handler and judge. Walt Jagger provided the katahdin ewes and lambs which were mixed with Mary Brighoff's Katahdins. This provided a substantial challenge for the first day of open. A maltese cross and a right hand drive made for the handlers and dogs to be creative. Laura Rizzo had in her words "the run of my life" and won it with a score of 95. Walt Jagger was reserve with Kitt.

The trial ran like clockwork due to the skillful and careful setting out of the sheep by J.P. LaLonde. Joyce Geier and her rough black and white dog Tait won the honors on Sunday with a

beautiful run on a more traditional course with a left hand drive and a shed. Barbara Klein took the reserve placing.

The eye clinic on Saturday with Dr. Kern from Cornell brought large numbers of dogs. Several vendors were available with their wares on all the days. Ross Klein from Joy Pet Foods was on hand with dog food treats and samples to pass out to all spectators and handlers alike. He also was right there to hand the winners their dog food along with their checks to fifteenth place. Great meals including a catered ham dinner on Friday and breakfast and lunch each day was provided by the Universalist church as always at the trial. The Deckertown 4-H were on hand for the novice days. The Jagger and Williams families would like to express their heartfelt thanks to all who were on the front line to help make sure the trial ran smoothly with all of the challenges presented. Dick Williams had just had surgery which made it necessary for more help than usual. Without the team of Annie Palmer, Jim and JoAnn Murphy, Mary Brighoff, and Alix Cleveland in addition to Craig and Tracy Flynn, this trial would not have occurred.
