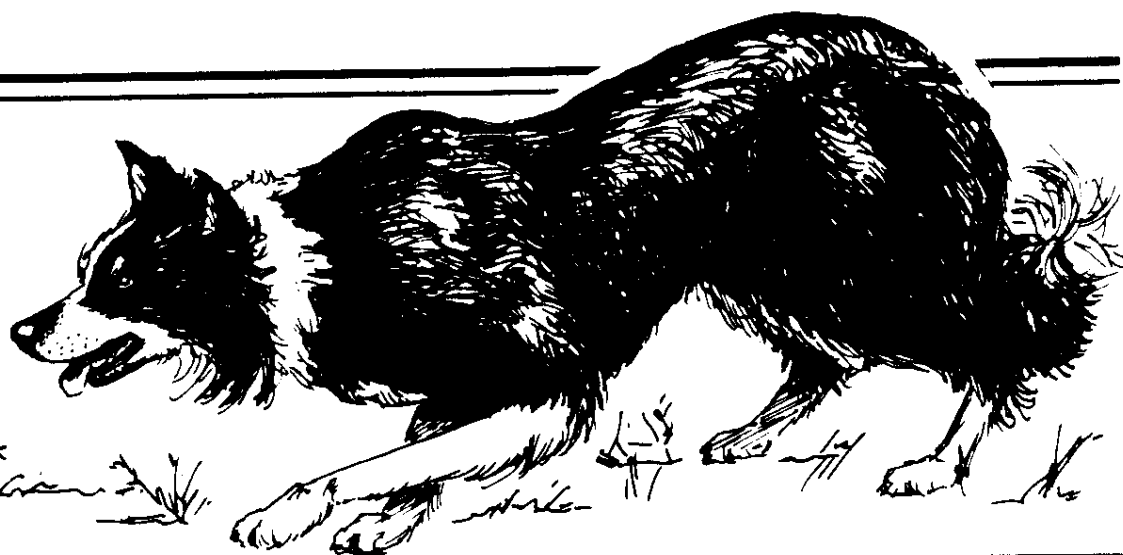

THE WEEKEND. This was the weekend that everyone had been working towards for the entire trial season. Only dogs who had placed four times in the top ten of a qualifying trial could run. This is the event of the year. Vergil and Bonnie Holland, our hosts for the weekend, went all out to make this a classic event. The field was challenging -- a long outrun that had the dog going around a wooded knob to get behind the sheep. If the dog went too wide, he would lose sight of the sheep and end up at the holding pen. Good thing we had three runs in order to get it right. Most of the dogs had a lot of trouble with the outrun. The drive was a right hand drive that was reasonably straight forward. The sheep were a little tough to pen, but most everyone got them in with 9 or more points. Then came the shed! The sheep did not want to split apart. It took a strong dog-

handler team to get a good shed. There were a lot of zero's on the board for shed points.

Vergil and Bonnie had arranged for some folks to put up a food concession, so we had hot coffee, chili, and steak sandwiches all day. The best of their food? GREAT home-made pies. They had also arranged for some Norfolk County Agricultural High School students to come all the way down from Boston to work the sheep pens. What a great help were these young women, our future farmers of America.

Rain and fog on Saturday morning did not dampen the spirits of the 14 competitors and 22 dogs. On Saturday we ran through all 22 dogs and then reran half of them again. Sunday dawned bright and clear, if

THE 1991 NEBCA FUTURITY

Two years ago, that is during the year of 1989, 32 dogs signed up to be considered for the NEBCA Futurity. Monday, October 14, 1991 -- that was the day, two long years later, when those 32 dogs were to be pitted against each other in the 1991 NEBCA Futurity. However, throughout the two years, many of the handlers were going to pull their dog from the competition. When the final day came, only seven dogs remained on the list and only six dogs ran.

It was a tough course for a two-year old dog to handle. It was the same course that was run over the last two days by the best open dogs that NEBCA could offer. The drive was changed so that no one who had run an open dog over the last

two days would be at an advantage, but the outrun remained the same. These 6 young dogs had the same problems with the outrun as the older dogs had over the last two days, but they all got it by the time they made their third run. They had the same trouble with the shed.

The day was beautiful. The competition was keen. It was close, right down to the last run of the day. Then, when the smoke cleared --

EDITORS' NOTES

Here we are, once again, at the end of the trial season. Normally, we would not be putting out this edition. What trial results were not reported to us during the season would have been included in the Winter issue that should reach you before Christmas. We would have also included the writeup's for the Fall Foliage Classic and the Futurity in that issue. Why then this issue?

There was a meeting following dinner on Saturday night after the first day of the Fall Foliage Trial. At the meeting there were a number of regular business issues discussed, and those are included in the minutes of the meeting. However, there was one issue that must be brought to the attention of the entire membership. Since it affects the Association's By-Laws, everyone must have a voice in the decision. There was a motion by Amanda Miliken to bring to you a resolution to raise the membership dues of NEBCA from \$10.00 per year to \$15.00 per year and to apply the additional \$5.00 to the Fall Foliage Trial. The argument that

was made in favor of this change was the following: Since our Association is dedicated to advancing the Border Collie Breed, and since the Fall Foliage Trial is THE trial of the season where members alone will benefit and the best Border Collies that the Northeast has to offer will be on display, and since we have for the last several years had to beg for money from sponsors in order to support the trial, and since sponsors will get little to no exposure for their donation; it was argued that the members should pay for this trial, as it is advancing the breed, through an increase in their dues. (1989 was the last year that Alpo donated \$1500 to the Fall Foliage Trial.)

The counter-argument that was put forth was the following: Yes, there is a need to increase dues because of higher costs of operating our Association, but No, that increase should not be wholly dedicated to one trial in the season; it was argued that the entire member body should not be responsible for sponsoring this one trial, that a budget could be established at the annual meeting out of the Treasury, but there should be no single pot of

money in our Treasury that be earmarked for any event or events. It was argued that budgeting decisions should be made annually and not as a part of a change in our By-Laws. It has been suggested that handlers competing in the Fall Foliage Championship Trial could be asked to pay a \$30 fee to run their dog.

Whichever way you feel we should go with the dues, it is important that you vote. These editors have been requested to make a change in the way the ballot is presented to the member body. In past elections, we have presented you with a ballot that should be mailed in, but should you forget, the absence of your ballot was taken as a 'yes' vote. In this case, we are presenting you with a ballot in which its tally will be made by counting missing ballots as 'no' votes. It is still important for you to vote. Remember, a 'yes' on the ballot means that you agree with the increase in dues AND that it should be earmarked to fund the Fall Foliage Trial; a 'no' vote means that you believe that there should be no increase in the dues. If you chose to vote 'no' but have any

other suggestions, please so indicate. Your voice MUST be heard by the executive committee if you expect them to represent you in our Association.

Steve Wetmore handed out trophies to the high point dogs for the year. We also recognized the many hours of work Eleanor Jagger puts in, keeping track of the points each dog in the Northeast accumulates by presenting Eleanor with a beautiful bowl.

The next meeting will be the Annual Meeting, for which we are looking for a central site in the Albany area.

Steve asked for volunteers to form a committee for next year's Fall Foliage Trial - there were no volunteers so a committee will be appointed.

Meeting was adjourned.

With the help of about eight people to stop traffic and track down the ewes and an able and much-excited dog to aim them down horse trails and creek beds, we managed to bring them all home safely.
