EDITORS' NOTES

Last month, Lynne ran out of room. Therefore, given the more important articles, she cut out fully two-thirds of the Editors' Notes. So what we have to say for this month may be a bit old, but, we think, still relevant. Plus we have another issue that must be brought to your attention. Now, we should all understand that these two editors are in the unique position of being able to voice our opinions and the only repercussions will be the heat we take after we distribute the newsletter. But, you are in the unique position of being able to ignore what we say. Therefore, we must together strike a very important balance -- we, keeping our own opinions to a minimum, bringing up issues that seem to have a larger audience; and you letting us know what are the important issues to you. Therefore, we try desperately to bring to your attention what is going on in our organization so that you can make your voice heard by the Executive Committee or the

Board of Directors -- these are the people who set the direction for NEBCA.

Therefore, first on our list are the efforts by an individual or two to control the trial program. Particularly, what do you think when a trial manager's choice of a judge is challenged and he is forced to change judges at the very last moment? You will read in our By-Laws, and you will hear from all members who had a hand in the creation of NEBCA, that we cannot be a policing organization. Our trial "rules" are not rules but guidelines; our list of "approved" judges is only a list of suggested judges; our description of trial courses are only suggested courses. In these editors' opinion, it is tough enough to put on a trial (and thanks to all of you who go through that ordeal) that NO ONE has the right to demand how that trial will be run or by whom it will be judged. This smacks of the old days when judges were picked for who they knew NOT what they knew.

Second on our list is the Breeders Directory. For as long as there has been a Newsletter, we have published a list of people who wanted to be called breeders and were willing to pay an extra \$10.00. There were no controls placed on the list, only a disclaimer that "buyer beware". However, now that we are all anxious to encourage responsible breeding, there are many who would like to shorten the list by eliminating all but the "serious" breeder (I am assuming that the motives of these people are not personal). Suggestions have come in to increase the fee to \$100.00, which will surely eliminate all but those breeders who breed enough litters to cover this decadent price. How about you? Do you want to see a list that includes even the "hobby" breeder, or would you like to see the list pared down to only the serious, multi-litter breeders? Write to your officers and let them know.

Finally, PLEASE SEND US PHOTOS for publication! The

Retinal dysplasia is a congenital maldevelopment of the retina. It is an inherited defect. In a severe case there may be complete retinal detachment and the dog will be blind, but a mild case may be discovered only with an exam. Since it is due to a recessive gene, dogs can be carriers without showing any sign at all even in an exam, but their puppies may have the disease. Dogs with the disease and dogs known to produce affected puppies should not be used for breeding. If a young puppy (6-8 weeks)appear to exhibit RD, another exam should be given when the dog is older. Folds in the retina due to differential growth can resemble RD but may disappear. In that case, the dog did not have RD and the early signs were not indicative of a genetic problem. (Information obtained from the Merck Veterinary Manual and Dr. Donovan.)

Cummington Eye Clinic

The Eye Clinic held at the Cummington Trial on May 29 was a resounding success. Many thanks to the people who helped fill out forms and put in eye drops - Michael Dathe, Edie Overly, Sally Lacy, Lynn Deschambeault and Jean Kennedy put in a long day. And further thanks to Becky Peterson who arranged for the clinic to be held at the Cummington Trial and found us a building to use. Dr. Donovan tested 81 dogs between 10:30 a.m. and 5:30 p.m. with only a short break for lunch (and used as much care with the last dogs as with the first).

The clinic was a bargain because the American Border Collie Association gave funds to help lower the cost. Although the vet charged \$14 per dog,

people paid \$13 for their first dog and \$12 for additional dogs; some people had as many as five tested. Several people said that they got more of their dogs tested because of the low price. We are even going to be able to return about \$50 of the ABC money that was unused - maybe they will give it back to us next year for another worthwhile project.


Of the dogs tested, 71 were Border Collies. (Other breeds, unsubsidized, were charged more.) Dr. Donovan found five Border Collies with problems. One had cataracts, and four had retinal dysplasia. Three of the four cases were moderate, one more severe. All results were confidential. Dr. Donovan reported only the totals when the clinic was over.

After weeks of planning and nail-biting, the 20th Annual Massachusetts Sheep and Woolcraft Fair and Dog Trial went off without a hitch. This proved to be the biggest trial Cummington has ever seen with 52 nursery dogs and 50 dogs in the Open Class. Handlers mostly came from New England, Pennsylvania, New York and Quebec. Their participation is most appreciated. The Judge for the weekend was Mike Canaday, with the exception of the Pro-Novice Class which was judged by Cheryl Jagger Williams.

The weather was great for all concerned except overnight on Saturday when the temperature dropped to 32 and those in tents were a little chilly.

The sheep belonged to Mike Canaday and worked very well in groups of five for the Nursery Trial. VIDEO REVIEW: Training the Working Stock Dog, by ElvinKopp

Not having watched very many videos, I wasn't able to compare this program to others, but I felt that this was a very good demonstration of training a stock dog. The video opens with very scenic views of B.C.'s and men on horseback working beef cattle. The picture quality and sound were good, and the instructor wore a microphone so that the viewer hears everything going on between the handler and the dog and gets a feel for when the commands should be given.

This program explains the heading instinct and the dog's desire to bring stock to the handler. Elvin touches on why the stockman gets frustrated with the dog that keeps bringing the stock back out of the chute while the man keeps trying to get them in there. I thought that was an important point to make, as that seems to be the problem of many beginners, especially farmers. He explains correcting your dog in dog language, mainly by eye contact and growling in dog fashion. It appears to be very effective. He explains balance using the "clock" and the dog's desire to be on balance as a way of training. Elvin emphasizes distance


and keeping the dog back off of the stock as being the most important trait after the dog's instinct itself and demonstrates how to get that distance. He wants the dog to control the stock with his sense, confidence and power, as opposed to his teeth. He doesn't hurry the dog and stresses that he wants to make it as easy as possible for the dog to understand what it is he wants. He doesn't press for side commands until the dog can stay off of his sheep, make a good outrun and read his sheep.

On the negative side (if you want to call it that), the dogs used in this tape mostly seemed to already know the job to some extent so that the obstacles in their training aren't as readily apparent. They make it look pretty easy.

All in all, I feel that this was a good program to watch. The instructor seems to have a good relationship with his dogs and works quietly with them. The corrections given were not stressful and were effective. I felt the explanations were very understandable and that this tape would be an excellent help to the beginning handler and the very experienced also.



Handlers, please remember to be very careful with those "non-competitive runs". We would like to see everyone get their money's worth for all the travelling involved with getting to the trials. It's great to give the young dogs as much experience away from home as we can give them. It is suggested that trial managers offer a "non-competitive" class to be run after all of the three sanctioned classes have run. You may then enter your dog in whatever class you wish and it won't count for points or move you up. You may not, however, run your dog competitively after you have him in a non-competitive run, on the same field at the same trial. This would give him an unfair advantage over the other dogs. Hence, the "non-competitive" class is after all normal runs.

If you choose to move your dog up a class before he has earned the 30 points, you may do so, but you may not go back down again if it is a sanctioned trial class. Also, the 30 points is pre-requisite for receiving your certificate of merit.

It was requested that we restate some of these issues clearly from time to time. Our thanks for your patience if you are already familiar with the program.

Anyone having questions is encouraged to contact the Nursery Trial Committee members listed below. All trial managers have a copy of the "Guidelines and Suggestions" from NEBCA. If you need another copy yourself, please ask any of us for it!

And - keep up the good work! There are a lot of good dogs and good new handlers on the scene this year!
