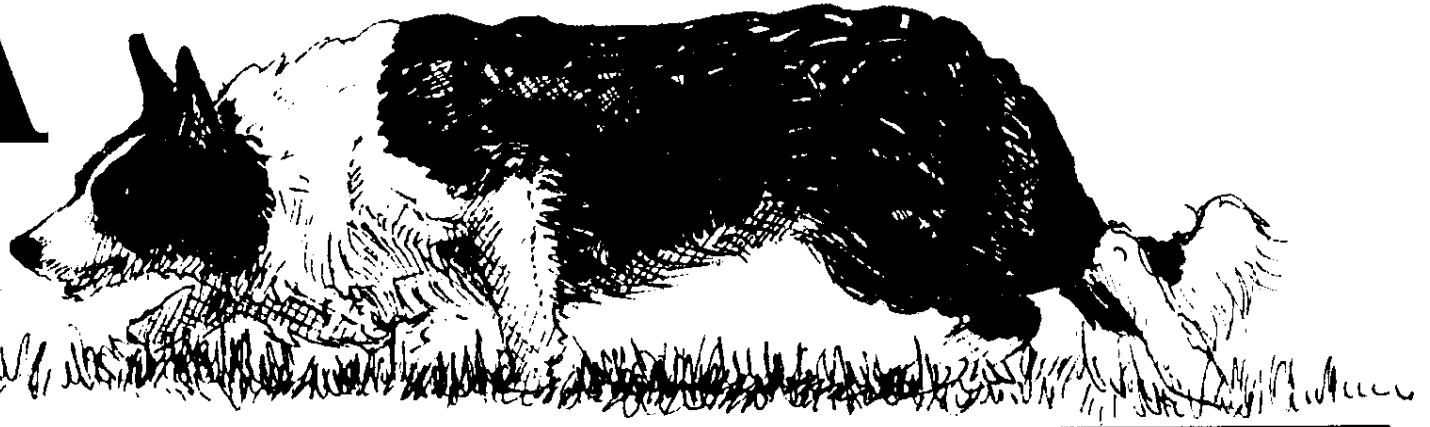

1995 NEBCA Fall Foliage Championship

Eve Marschark, Trials Committee Chairman

Plans are underway for the 1995 Fall Foliage Championship to be held at Fosterfields Farm in Morristown, New Jersey on the traditional Columbus Day Weekend, October 7th & 8th, 1995. The trial will be sponsored by the Morristown Park Commission and the Friends of Fosterfield. Gene Sheninger has generously offered to not only manage the trial but to loan us the use of his sheep, free of charge. NEBCA would like to thank Gene for all he is doing for us.

Our judge for the championship is Ms. Julie Depford from the UK. Beverly Lambert will be picking her up at the Boston Airport. She is then scheduled to judge Roger Deschambeault's trials in Maine and New Hampshire the weekend before the Fall Foliage. We split the airline ticket with these trials saving NEBCA quite nicely on the judges fees. In addition, Julie will be conducting a handling clinic and a judging clinic following the trial. (See elsewhere in this newsletter for times and dates.)

A meeting of the trials committee was held at Mike Canaday's trial in August. Attending were: Roger Deschambeault, Walt Jagger, Bev Lambert, Betty Levin, Eve Marschark and Gene Sheninger. The following was agreed upon:

Sheep crew – to pay 2 people \$100.00 each for 2 days=\$200.00. Gene will find college kids or local help for the holding pens.

Set-out crew with dogs. Bev will search for volunteers to spot with their dogs. Volunteers are offered free admission to the judging clinic. She is also looking for people to help with the secreting, clerking, posting of scores, etc.

Porta Potties – Gene has asked Fosterfields to provide the potties. Confirmation should come within a couple of weeks.

Dinner: we will have access to the building for dinner. Boston Chicken will be ordered and delivered. Cost is being researched by Gene. Alternately, Friends of Fosterfield may wish to handle the dinner. Gene will let us know.

Sheep charge: free, Gene is donating his Katadins.

Printing: Carol Campion will donate her time to compile the program. Costs for printing will be researched and determined based on how many we print. Bev Lambert will help coordinate this with last years program. Gene will find out if Fosterfields wants to place an ad. Anyone else wishing to place an ad should provide camera ready copy to Carol or Beverly. If you need an ad done up, see Carol.

Awards: Handmade pottery mugs were agreed upon. Eve is to contact Becky Peterson to place an order with Becky's potter for both the high points and Fall Foliage Champions.

Entry Fee: \$20.00 per dog for the 2 days.

Starting time: 9:00 am.

Julie Depford Clinics

The judge for this years Fall Foliage Championship will be Ms. Julie Depford of Scotland. Julie is a renowned competitor and qualified judge and we are honored to have her take part in this event.

While visiting, NEBCA has taken advantage of having her here by organizing two advanced clinics. The first will be a handling clinic to be held in Portland Connecticut on Tuesday, October 3 & Wednesday, October 4th. There will be a 12 dog/handler limit for those participating in this clinic. Observers are welcome. The cost to participate is \$85.00 for two days, to observe, \$30.00 for two days, \$20.00 for one day. Spaces are filling quickly so contact Bev Lambert at 203-742-5300 as soon as possible.

The second clinic is a judging clinic to be held October 9th, the Monday following the Fall Foliage Festival. This event will be held at Fosterfields in Morristown, New Jersey. There is a \$20.00 fee for this clinic, well worth the price. Contact Bev Lambert concerning this event also.

Directions to Fosterfields

You are cordially invited to attend the 1995 NEBCA Fall Foliage at Fosterfields in historic Morristown, New Jersey. Fosterfields is a turn-of-the-century "Living Historical Farm" representing the period from 1880 to 1910. The farm was named after Charles Foster, a wealthy New York businessman who moved to Morristown in 1880 to take up farming. His daughter, Caroline, continued to operate the farm after his death in 1927

and subsequently donated it to the Morris County Park Commission in 1974.

**Morristown is located off of
Interstate 287 in New Jersey.**

From Rt. 287, take Exit 35 coming from the south, Exit 38 from north, east and west. Get onto Rt. 510/124 (South Street) and proceed west through Morristown. Follow Rt. 510 sign COUNTERCLOCKWISE around the Morristown Green, turning right onto Washington Av. (When

approaching the green, you must turn a left, another left and a quick right around the green to keep on Rt. 510.) One mile after the green, look for Kahdena Rd. on the right. Turn onto Kahdena and go about 1/4 mile to the Fosterfields Visitor Center. Watch for signs and help to guide you to the trial field.

**The trial starts at 9:00 am.
We expect a good turnout.

From the Editor...

As editor of the NEBCA Newsletter, I would like to extend an apology to the organizers and managers of the Pittsburg Township Sheep Dog Trial. Their trial did not get covered, let alone even mentioned, in the "Get Out To A Trial" column in the last issue of the NEBCA News. This is an established, prestigious and extremely well organized part of the NEBCA circuit and should have been given the attention it deserves along with the other trials that were described for the month of August. The omission was purely unintentional and the only reason that can be cited for it would be "too much typing, too late at night". When I'm sitting up at 1:00 AM and 2:00 AM in the morning trying to think of "fillers" for this newsletter, it's easy to miss something.

The Pittsburg Township Trial took place on the same weekend as the first Leatherstocking Sheep Dog Trial. The Leatherstocking Trial was mentioned in that column and not Pittsburg. When this oversight was brought to my attention, much to my surprise, it was addressed in the context of the seemingly growing rift that has been occurring between some Canadians and US Border Collie handlers and owners. NEBCA's unresolved question of keeping Ontario as part of its geographical area has concerned some and cast suspicion over such innocent oversights as my own. Hopefully this territory issue can be resolved.

As far as two big trials conflicting on one weekend, I, for one, do not like to see any trials competing for attendance with one another. If trials do not draw enough handlers to allow the entries to support them, we will start seeing a loss of trials as some will not be able to continue, financially. It is to everyone's benefit, when planning trials for 1996, to go to whatever lengths you must to secure a date that has no conflicts. That way, more handlers are free to support each event helping to guarantee their success and therefore continued opportunities to run our dogs.

While I am addressing "Issues", I would like to address another that has been rumored to me over the last few months. It seems that there were a number of people "insulted" by the title "Supreme Champion" on the cover of the Spring NEBCA News. They feel that the title should only be used overseas and the NEBCA News has no right calling their Supreme Champion by that name. I'll stand by that cover and its design. The cover gives credit to a dog that won exactly that title, Supreme Champion, within this organization. This newsletter is intended solely for the pleasure of its own members who know their double champion by that name, and the large NEBCA logo stands out on the page clearly indicating that this is the NEBCA Supreme Champion, none other. The same logic goes for the NEBCA ad displayed in other magazines. For those who feel that this title is in poor taste, I would urge them to speak to the members of the Board of Directors of NEBCA.

If you have an event taking place, please make sure that you send the information directly to the editor of the newsletter. Sometimes information does not get passed along the way we assume that it will, so to assure listing and publicity for your event, the trial manager should contact this newsletter as well as the trial committees. Unfortunately, there was a nursery trial overlooked this season, and we would like to guarantee that does not happen again. Thanks.

Leatherstocking Sheep Dog Trials

Cooperstown, New York August 11-13 Judge: Tom Conn

The first Leatherstocking Sheepdog Trials were well attended by both handlers and spectators. The showers on Friday and a heavy downpour on Saturday did not dampen spirits as everyone temporarily crowded under a large tent. Sunday's weather was beautiful. Tom Conn, recently returned from judging in Wales, did a faultless job putting in a 13 hour day on Saturday without complaint. "The course was more difficult than any I saw in Wales" he said. The low scores and the large number of "retires" were an indication of the deceptively challenging terrain of the Waterwheel Woodworks Farm.

Special thanks to Heather Millen who handled most of the paperwork and score posting, to Liz Phillips who spent days in the holding pen, all the scorekeepers, sheep holders, announcers, Regal Dog Food, the Means grandchildren who sold trial booklets to over 500 spectators, the management team of Barb & Chalmers Means and Bernie & Barb Armata, and all you folks who helped make the first trial a success. We could not have done it without you!

"Why 'Leatherstocking' ", you ask? The area around Cooperstown is called Leatherstocking country because of James Fenimore Cooper's novels. Cooper's hero, Natty Bumppo, was called Leatherstocking because of the leather breeches he wore on his legs. Leather stockings were Indian leggings reaching from ankle to mid-thigh, shaped to the leg and held by a thong tied to the belt.

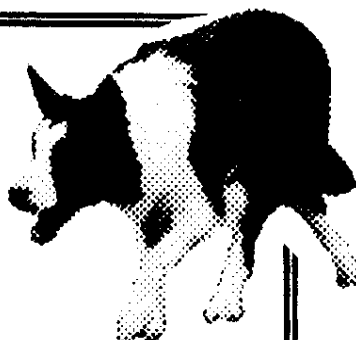

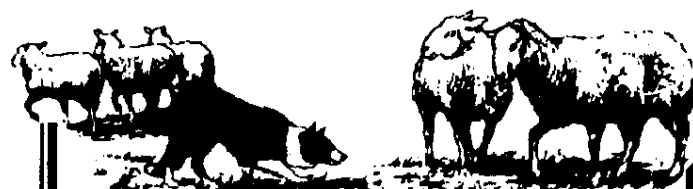
